Under 29iv of the Call-in Procedure:

29iv (a) and (h) Evidence was presented at the Cabinet meeting in my Statement (previously circulated to all Members) which demonstrated the said decision will cause significant harm to the local economy with detrimental effects on the local businesses leading to a further decline of the Chichester city centre and High streets in the District. The impact of these charges during the current pandemic and the long-term ability to recover long after the new charges are implemented was not fully considered by Cabinet in their debate.
