The university believes that more of its projects in the IBP especially those for additional student accommodation in the 'phasing not known' category should be moved into the short term list of priorities for the defined 5- year period 2022/2027. This is because proposals for additional student accommodation are already in preparation and delivery is anticipated over this period. Moving the projects out of the 'phasing not known' category in the IBP would also remedy the phasing mix match for additional student accommodation specified for around 2022 in the Council's separate Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP).

Other projects in the IBP 'phasing not known' category need to be brought forward as priorities because they would provide justifiable safety improvements for students and local people. As an example, the lighting in College Lane is very poor and needs improving (there have been recent traffic related and student welfare incidents at the start of this term already). The University therefore believes that amendments to the phasing of certain of the projects and priorities in the IBP should be revisited including improved lighting at College Lane.

This would link to schemes to improve the northern side of Oaklands Way and Oaklands Way roundabout) are prioritised as Policy High in the IBP but would prefer it if project IBP/846 for the cycleway route B could be extended to link with other cycleway projects proposed for the central zone of Chichester, to create a continuous link to the rail station. This would provide sustainability and highway safety benefits not only for its students but residents alike who have chosen cycling as their principal mode of travel.

The initiative to create a continuous cycle link to the station would chime with your Council's declared 'Climate Emergency' status and could be included as a deliverable measure in your Climate Emergency Action Plan too.

The University would like to take this opportunity to point out there is very rapid growth in electric scooter use by its students. It therefore suggests the provision and planning of the wider cycleway network should be designed to cater for scooter use as well. Although not a CIL related initiative, the University would welcome advice on the policy position for scooter use across the City in highway terms from the Local Highway Authority.

BP/379 (Student Residential - Redevelopment of Havenstoke (252 new units) and redevelopment of Hammond (77 new units)) is subject to change and the anticipated number of student rooms is being reconsidered and is likely to be re-provided between the 2 locations with more at Havenstoke of around 250-300 units.

The University invites the Council to reconsider whether other projects could be included for full CIL funding namely:

- IBP/383 (Cycle route/footway with lighting to the centre of the campus) approx, £500,000:
  - IBP/386 (Cycle route/footway with lighting extension from the University central area to Graylingwell north) approx. £500,000; and
  - IBP/384 (New Internal Campus Road and link to Eastern Access Road) approx. £500,000 to address the funding gap for the internal campus

The addition of these projects to the CIL 'high priority list' for delivery in the short term to 2027 would be justified as they would support wider strategic or site-specific objectives set out in planning policy in the adopted Chichester Local Plan (Key Policies).
