Pallant House Gallery Monitoring Report

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2. Recommendation

- 2.1 To receive the 2023/24 annual report from Pallant House Gallery and assess performance in line with the monitoring framework.**

3. Background

- 3.1 An annual cultural grant of £130,000 to Pallant House Gallery was approved by Cabinet in December 2016 for the years 2018-2022. Further extensions until March 2026 have been approved by Cabinet and Council.
- 3.2 Social and economic impact assessments have recently been completed by the gallery to inform future discussions and decisions around cultural grants and to recognise and quantify the positive impact culture has on the city and wider district.
- 3.3 The gallery continues to provide a cultural offering to local residents of national significance, undertake activities that benefit local residents through their community programmes, directly and indirectly benefit the wider cultural sector, and provide significant economic benefit to local businesses and other attractions.
- 3.4 The funding agreement for Pallant House Gallery is conditional upon the reporting to the satisfaction of the Council (acting reasonably) on annual activity. The content of the reporting is outlined in, but need not be limited to, the monitoring framework.

4. Outcomes to be achieved

- 4.1 In line with the Monitoring Framework there are a number of activities and measurements to be reported to the Council annually.
- 4.2 Details of these and a summary of how the gallery have evidenced and met these requirements can be viewed at Appendix 1 of this report.
- 4.3 Further information including the full annual report, statutory accounts, economic impact assessment and social impact assessment can be accessed as background papers.
- 4.4 The information provided by the gallery has been reviewed and officers believe they have met all of the requirements of the monitoring framework.

5. Resource and legal implications

- 5.1 Pallant House Gallery have submitted their statutory accounts to the Council within 6 months of the end of the financial year. These have been reviewed by the accountancy team and they have reported that PHG have made a gain of £1.2m this year. They have reserves of £44.7m of which £2.7m are unrestricted.

6. Community impact and corporate risks

- 6.1 The monitoring agreement outlines the areas of activity to be undertaken by Pallant House Gallery that demonstrate the benefits to the district, generated by the District Council's funding of the gallery.
- 6.2 The recent economic and social impact assessments highlight the financial and social/community benefit the theatre brings to the district and local community, and the main risk to the Council is a loss of this should these activities not continue.
